Message from the Executive Director



2025 was a year of impact and continued commitment to the children, youth, and families we serve. This year, nearly 1,700 members were registered across our various pillars of service, and more than 5,391 children, youth, and community members participated in our programs, workshops, and initiatives.

Our education programs continued to make a difference, with 249 members participating in educational programming. More than 60 youth also took part in our cooking programs, developing practical life skills and confidence in the kitchen. Through Newcomer Youth Services, more than 200 youth participated in entrepreneurship and job readiness programs, helping prepare them for future success. Food security remains a critical need in our community, and we were proud to serve more than 61,000 meals and snacks throughout the year. Our summer camps welcomed more than 400 children and youth, with a similar number remaining on waiting lists.

We were proud to continue our partnership with Krista Richard and the Community Sports Program, which provided more than 260 youth with access to organized sport in our location alone. By supporting registration and providing space for programming, we were able to help ensure that more young people could experience the benefits of sport, teamwork, and belonging. We also expanded our Early Learning Centre by opening an additional classroom, creating much-needed childcare spaces for children ages 0–5. In addition, we expanded our licensed Afterschool Program, allowing us to serve more children and youth than ever before.

One of the highlights of 2025 was reaching our fundraising goal for a new accessible playground. Thanks to the incredible support of our donors, funders, sponsors, and community partners, this exciting project will become a reality in 2026.

To all of our supporters, thank you for believing in our mission and helping create opportunities for children and youth in our community. Thank you to our staff team for their dedication, compassion, and hard work, and to our Board of Directors for their steady leadership and guidance throughout the year.

A special thank you to Marc-André Cormier for his leadership over the past three years as Board President, and we are pleased he will continue as Past President. We are also excited to welcome Jordan Hamilton as our incoming Board President and look forward to his leadership in the years ahead.
